Retired from a career in engineering, Hudson author Jim Guhl usually starts his day with a laptop, a notebook, pen, and a large coffee. His first novel, the award-winning *Eleven Miles to Oshkosh* was published in 2018 and is a coming-of-age story about a scrawny kid who struggles to get by in the Fox Valley Region of Wisconsin in the 1970s. There's a mystery inside the main plot as the 15-year-old protagonist tries to figure out who murdered his father. *South of Luck*, released in 2021, tells the tale of a 16-year-old ruffian whose mother sends him from Minneapolis to rural Polk County, Wisconsin. She claims that it'll do him good to be out in nature, but they both know it's an attempt to keep him safe from his brutal stepfather. 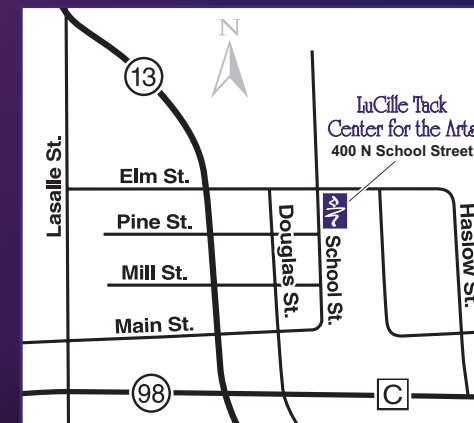
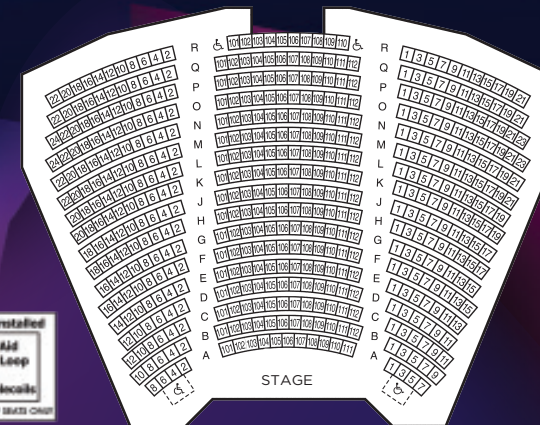
